



NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 SECTION 257 AND PARAGRAPH 7 OF SCHEDULE 14 WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (RESTRICTED BYWAY MR247B (PART), WROTHAM) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2020

On the 24th September 2020, Kent County Council confirmed the above Order under section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the entire width of that length of restricted byway numbered MR247B which commences at NGR TQ 6189 5815 (Point A) and runs in a south-easterly through to south south-easterly direction for 222 metres to NGR TQ 6201 5797 (Point B). As shown by the solid black line between points A-B on the Order Plan and will add a new length of restricted byway numbered MR247B with a width of 4.0 metres, which commences at NGR TQ 6189 5815 (Point A) and runs in a southerly direction for 73 metres to NGR TQ 6187 5808 (Point C) and then in a west-north-westerly direction for 20 metres to NGR TQ 6186 5809 (Point D) and then continues in a south-south westerly direction for 58 metres to NGR TQ 6182 5804 (Point E) and then in a east-south easterly direction for 153 metres to NGR TQ 6196 5797 (Point F), continuing in an east-north-easterly direction for 22 metres to NGR TQ 6198 5798 and then in a east-south-easterly direction for 23 metres to NGR TQ 6201 5797 (Point B). As shown by the broken black line with v shapes in the gaps between points A-C-D-E-F-B on the Order Plan.

All directions are general, all distances are approximate.

The Order comes into force on the date upon which the Kent County Council certifies that the terms of article 2 of the Order have been complied with, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to that Act.
